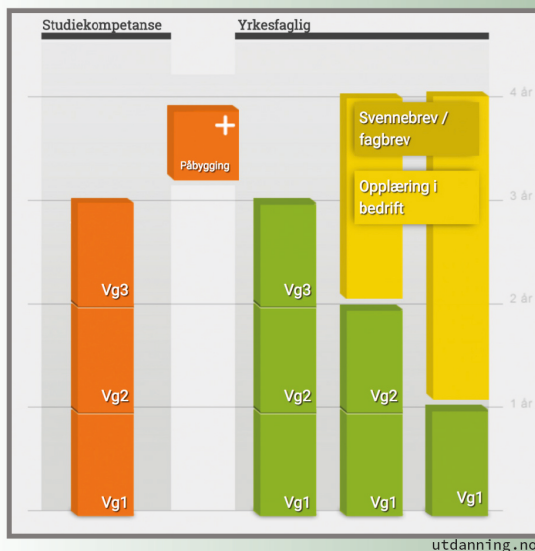


Did you know?



- ▶ In Norway, all young people are entitled to 3-5 years of free high school education.
- ▶ If you choose vocational studies, you can do a supplementary course which qualifies you for university studies.
- ▶ With a trade certificate you can start working as soon as you graduate, whereas if you choose general studies, you have to move on to at least three more years of studies in order to complete your degree.
- ▶ There are many careers which don't require higher education, but which nevertheless pay well.

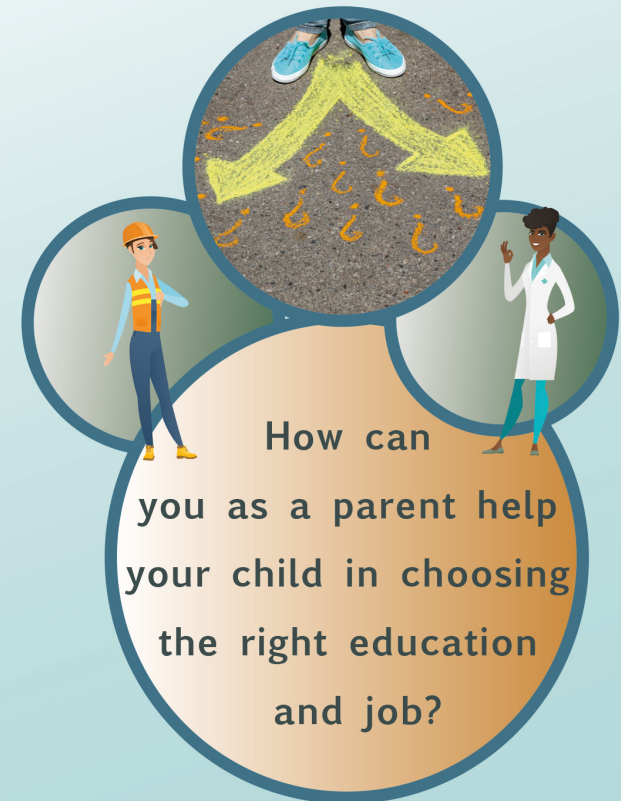
